Fourth Sunday of Lent 'Laetare Sunday'



The 4th Sunday of Lent invites us to see with the eyes of faith. The readings call us to recognize God's work in unexpected ways and to look beyond outward appearances. They challenge us to live as children of light and to trust God's purpose, even in times of struggle.

In the Gospel for the 4th Sunday of Lent Year A, Jesus heals a man born blind using dirt and saliva. These simple, ordinary things show that God can use anything to bring healing and grace. By using what was considered unclean in Jewish culture, Jesus shows his power to make all things holy.

This miracle also points to spiritual renewal. Just as the man's eyes were opened, we are called to open our hearts to God. Some see this as a symbol of baptism, where water washes away sin and brings new life. The man moves from darkness to light, just as we do when we are baptized.

Jesus also challenges the belief that suffering is a result of personal sin. He explains that the man's blindness was not a punishment but an opportunity to show God's glory. This reminds us that suffering can have a purpose beyond what we see.

This story invites us to reflect on how God works through ordinary things in our lives. It challenges us to see our struggles not as punishments but as ways God's power can be revealed. It calls us to trust in God's purpose and healing. (*young-catholics.com*)

Sacred Heart Lent Programme 2025

Lent is a season in the Church's calendar when we're invited, for 40 days, to find time for prayer and fasting. It's an opportunity for spiritual growth as we prepare to commemorate the suffering and death of Jesus Christ and the celebration of his resurrection at Easter. These 6 weeks mirror the amount of time that Jesus spent in the desert to fast and pray.

At Sunday Mass the following differences are observed to mark the change of season:

- the entrance procession is silent
- we kneel for the Penitential Rite
- the penitential rite is the triple trope formula
- there is no Gloria
- there are no Alleluias
- the Mass prayers are recited on a monotone
- the Apostles' Creed substitutes the usual Nicene Creed
- one of the Eucharistic Prayers for Reconciliation is used
- We use the English Plainchant settings from the Missal for the Holy, holy and Lamb of God
- there is an extra Prayer Over the People after Communion.

There are **no floral arrangements** as it is a penitential season.

There are **no Baptisms** as it is a season of preparation for Baptism.

Fr. Jeremy and Fr. James will be celebrating an extra **Mass at 7.30am** Monday to Friday excluding Tuesday (*please check newsletter on a weekly basis*). If you would like to book a Mass for a loved one, occasion, private intention or thanksgiving during this time please contact Lisa at the Presbytery to arrange. 

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

Saturdays of Lent @ 5pm



The Stations of the Cross are a 14-step Catholic devotion that commemorates Jesus Christ's last day on Earth as a man. The 14 devotions, or stations, focus on specific events of His last day, beginning with His condemnation. The stations are commonly used as a mini pilgrimage as the individual moves from station to station. At each station, the individual recalls and meditates on a specific event from Christ's last day. Specific prayers are recited, then the individual moves to the next station until all 14 are complete.

Lent Book and Station Masses

This Lent, our shared book for our Pastoral Area is UNBOUND, by Neil Lozano. Its chapters will form the background and reflection for each of the Station Masses on Tuesdays in Lent.

'As a teacher on deliverance, Neal Lozano knows that many believers struggle with the same sin areas time after time. Yet victory can be as simple as tapping into the potent power of the gospel. By focusing on Jesus and his work, rather than on the intimidating aspects of evil spirits, readers can reset their mindset about their spiritual struggles'. (*Amazon review*)

Neal Lozano (born 1949) is a non-fiction author who has run a deliverance ministry for over 35 years. He currently serves as a senior coordinator of the House of God's Light, an interdenominational Christian community which he has pastored for thirty years.


